#### **Mission Moment**

Latin Dance program. Terrific turnout. 80 students involved. 53 performed. Once a week dance practice with professional dance instructors. Group of judges judge on Salsa, Merengue, Second Place and 1st place. William Allen stage crew is essential. 14 volunteers, including a Whitehall student. The Morning Call printed pictures of each of the schools and had a great gallery of pictures on line. LehighValleyNews.com came and stayed for whole time and did a very nice story. Acting Superintendent attended as well. It is heartwarming to see how proud the families are. Students have a whole range of reasons to do this. SMMS coach said their students want to make a club out of this, to dance at nursing homes etc. Students cheered the other schools. This started as a TIG grant. Davian talked about how this is great to reinforce the Latin culture of many of the students and their families. Kenny said it was a good way for students to express themselves.

### EITC Update

November is a big month for EITC. Received quite a few contributions. Some new and some increases. Unusual for grants to go up so we are very fortunate for the increases. 8 received so far and waiting for 3 more who have given in the past. They cannot give it directly to the ASD. Most are unrestricted; one has a STEM restriction.

#### **Outstanding Grants Update**

Received four grants so far and have a number that are outstanding. Applying today to Trexler Trust for money for the Science Fair and summer LCTI Camp, STEM career day with people who built new DaVinci Science Center. Hope to have entire 7<sup>th</sup> or 8<sup>th</sup> grade have this in the fall and

then go and see it when the Center opens. Career readiness and new science curriculum emphasis. Will support ASD on these goals. Bill Sugra Memorial Fund will not be giving out funds in the future, after 20 years.

#### Annual Appeal

Beginning of November sent out Annual Appeal and Report. Goal is to raise \$60,000. Mailed to 1713. First year that we did Giving Tuesday. Didn't set a goal this year (should do so next year). Did a pilot to highlight what ASDF does. Posted on social media and asked Board to do the same. Raised \$1,800. Some feedback: Board members didn't see it until about 5 p.m. Sent out early in the morning. Didn't want people to unsubscribe from our feed so didn't want to send too much. Wonder if the Foundation is not that recognizable. Julie is grateful to the Public Relations Committee to work on this. Happy with what we did and good foundation for next year.

#### <u>Literacy Volunteer Program</u>

Started 5 years ago. Train and do background checks on volunteers. Rebuilding since the pandemic. Doing an orientation about once a month at Hays Elementary School. Four trained in October; 7 in November. Trying to get back to 100. Currently have 42 volunteers active. Getting a lot of support from new Literacy Director, Kelly Ballard. Before 4<sup>th</sup> grade, children are learning to read. From 4<sup>th</sup> grade on, they are reading to learn. If volunteers can't fit into what we do, we can direct them to other opportunities in the district. Most volunteers are retired but we also work with colleges and companies.

# Visual & Performing Arts Residencies

Latin Dance is one of these. Middle School Strings at Raub with El Sistema has 23 students involved. String students will perform on Wed. Dec. 14, in the Raub Holiday Concert, at 6 p.m. Visual Arts, mostly in elementary schools. 2 resident artists: Roe Gesek oil pastels at Hays and Mosser; and Claire Marcus at Roosevelt grades 2 and 5 book and paper arts. Art is showcased at ASDF events, used for fundraising to go back into the arts program.
